Staff Egg & Spoon race

Our Manager Alastair starting off the race strong with his agile movements to the bench and back ready to pass the egg to the next member of staff.

All staff got a little bit competitive, if they say they didn't I think that may have been a little white lie :)



Egg & Spoon Race Rules

Each team MUST consist of 5 members of staff.

Each team will race all 5 members and this will be timed.

The winning Team will be the fastest timed (including penalties)

Penalties-5 second for every time the egg is touched by anyone's hand during your race for more than 2 seconds (no you can't hold the egg for the entirety of the race and only expect 5 second penalty)

Race starts with 1st team member sitting on their chair with egg and spoon in hand (clock starts when you leave the chair)

Race finishes when last person in their team returns to a seated position

The course will be to the chair at the end of the course and back.

On route the "racer" must take up the seated position on the chair at the opposite end of the course before getting up again and completing the course from the starting chair where the next member of the team MUST be seated ready to take over control of the Egg and Spoon.

Team finishing last (slowest team including penalties) will have their team Leader placed in the "stocks" on a suitable (weather dependent) Thursday games afternoon and be "pelted" with wet sponges (until the staff participants money runs out....£1 for three throws...all proceeds to staff funds.)

Now the Fun Bit !!!!

One of the 4 eggs (one for each team) is "runny"the other 3 are hard boiled.

Should the unlucky team (eggs chosen at random from a tub) to have and break the runny egg MUST gain a new Egg from the point on the course designated and continue from the point that


Happy 71st Wedding Anniversary to Pauline and Len. We hope you had a wonderful day with one another and your family.





Iris enjoyed her birthday celebrations with a beautiful cake from the kitchen and opened her cards and presents with all the residents in the dining room.






Happy Birthday to David. Staff, family, and friends visited Norwood House to see David, to make his day just that little bit special. David's eyes lit up when his cake was brought out.



Happy Birthday, Casey!


Casey celebrated his birthday with a lovely cake shared with all the residents

Ball Games


Ball Games

A few of our residents got together with the Activities staff and arranged some beautiful flowers to go round the home.






The Activities team set up their creative table for the residents and staff to make some Kites.
